Tutoring

The Board does not promote or provide for private tutoring. However, if tutoring is necessary, the following procedures will be followed.

- 1. A parent or student may discuss the advisability of private tutoring with the teacher, counselor, or building principal. A cooperative relationship will be established among the school, the tutor, and the parent to provide the best instructional setting for the student.
- 2. It is the responsibility of parent and the tutor to agree mutually upon a fee and place for tutoring.
- 3. Any tutoring for pay will not occur within public school buildings.
- 4. A teacher who has had or has a student enrolled in his/her class will not accept employment as a paid tutor for that student in that subject.
- 5. A teacher may not tutor individual students for pay when the instruction occurs during the school day.
- 6. A teacher may not tutor his/her own individual students for pay when additional help is needed for the student to meet minimum requirements for the course.
- 7. Private music lessons are not considered tutoring. Students may be encouraged but not required to take private music lessons in non-school hours.
